

Graduate to Proficient

A program designed to meet the needs of graduate teachers in their first two years of teaching who are working towards the Proficient level of the Australian Professional Standard for Teachers.

Please Note:

This is a four day course, two of which are school days. Participants are expected to commit fully to all four days and to the preparation and actions required. Participants need to have the support of their Principal.

The course will assist graduates working towards full registration as a teacher with the Teacher Registration Board of Western Australia. Participants will be guided through the process of collecting evidence and unpacking the descriptors at the Proficient level in detail. They will work with the AITSL Observation Tool and discuss Illustrations of Practice. Some time will also be devoted to the challenges facing beginning teachers.

It is anticipated that these teachers will working through the Mentored transition process as described below:

"<u>Mentored transition process</u>: I have taught for at least 180 days in total^{*} in the past 5 years in an educational venue in Western Australia and have been supported by a mentor during that time. I have collected and retained evidence that demonstrates I now meet the professional standards for teachers[#] at the Proficient level. This evidence has been reviewed by my supervisor who has also observed my teaching on several occasions."

*Part-time and relief teachers must have taught for a period of time that would be equivalent in hours to at least 180 days.

You may refer either to the Professional Standards for Teachers in Western Australia or to the National Professional Standards for Teachers because they are the same in material respects.
